20 July 2021 Update - Kokatha Aboriginal Corporation COVID-19 Safety Measures

Kokatha Aboriginal Corporation (KAC) continues to manage the COVID-19 threat in accordance with current government advice and requirements, whilst also taking a precautionary approach to ensure as much protection of staff and community members as possible.

The state government has announced Level 5 COVID-19 restrictions- stay at home order. The Premier has advised that these restrictions will be in place until at least Tuesday 27th July.

KAC's first priority remains the wellbeing of Kokatha people and KAC staff. As such, from 21 June 2021 until further notice, KAC will reinstitute the majority of measures successfully put in place during the 2020 statewide lockdowns.

That is:

- All KAC Offices will be closed
- All corporate staff will be working from home and will be available during work hours via email, zoom video conferencing and mobile phone. Office calls will be redirected. Staff contact details are available on our website at <https://kokatha.com.au/staff/>
- As non essential travel is not permitted, travel requests will not be authorised
- Face to face meetings, gathering and events are to be postponed or transitioned to a virtual format

If restrictions are declared for the community of South Australia this means they are subject to level 1, 2, 3, 4 or 5 requirements. People MUST comply with the requirements set out in the table below.
